The Year in Review

At times during the Liberian civil war, we did not think the team or the Lifewater program would survive. Well it didn't just survive - with your support it has thrived! From its start drilling just 3 wells in 1995, the local team is now averaging nearly 1 new well every week! In 2007 the they finished their 200th well safe drinking water for over 50,000 people! Hundreds of lives have been saved since up to 25% of all Liberian children die from diseases related to unsafe water and inadequate sanitation!

As summarized in this newsletter, other significant events include:

- starting a well sponsorship program in Kenya;
- expanding community health through hygiene programs
- starting a village pump repair training program
- revamping our web site which offers free resources to aid workers around the world.

On behalf of the men, women and children who have benefitted from this work, I thank you for your support which made it possible.

New Project Team

Thanks to your generous donations and our overhead staying under 5%, we were able to extend a helping hand to GWAKO Ministries in Northern Kenya. GWAKO supports women's co-operatives which are formed to help members buy house furniture, utensils etc. Sadly, most members are young widows whose husbands died from HIV/AIDS. Read what a difference your support in helping them obtain safe drinking water makes in their lives:

"The girl child, who traditionally and culturally, is the one to help the mother in domestic chores. have to wake-up very early to find the water still settled, as the same water point is being used with both human and animals. The result has been the girls do not perform as boys when it comes to examinations. With the provided water point, the lives of both our animals and ourselves will improve tremendously. Water, and not just water, but safe drinking water, is now available when you need it, giving us time to attend to other economical activities. The performance of the girl child will dramatically improve as they are now having equal learning time with their boy counterparts".

New Program Areas

The benefit of safe drinking water has been extended by integrating drilling with a community health through hygiene program. This program teaches villagers how diseases are transmitted and how to keep from getting sick. The Liberia team now has a full-time Hygiene Coordinator and two hygiene workers have been hired.

Volunteer trainers also helped the Liberian crew start a pump maintenance program. The goal is to train Well Caretakers and Pump Technicians from each village who perform routine maintenance activities to keep pumps from breaking and "sitting spoiled". 200th Well in Liberia

A "life-time memory" was hearing 150 choir members from 19 churches blend their voices in celebration. We have been working with folks in Zambia and Haiti and within the next few months you will be able to sponsor projects in these countries if you wish.

At the end of October, a small team of volunteers will be spending several weeks in Liberia. Trip goals include providing advanced drill training, business skills assessment and helping develop the pump maintenance program. Also, the Liberian team has recently purchased 5 acres of land on the outskirts of Monrovia on which they hope to build a compound. A key part of their plans is a workshop and a warehouse. This will enable them to stockpile material during the rainy season so that they do not have to waste time during the dry season buying supplies like rock, gravel, well casing, cement etc. If you would like to help the Liberian workers become more economically independent, please mark your donation as "Liberian Compound Fund".
